### Discussion to increase City of Guyton Millage rate to 3.655 mills

Mayor Lariscy took a few moments to recap the information from the previous public hearing in regards to the County assessed millage rate, and the funds the cities are no longer receiving. Councilman Goldwire asked if this increase was a "catch-up" and Mayor Lariscy responded that it was. Councilman Johnson asked if this would be for roads and recreation, and Mayor Lariscy stated that the City would not be bound to that. Mayor Lariscy stated the .934 mills for recreation that the County would be collecting from the Guyton citizens would yield approximately \$50,000. He added that Council

would be sending a letter to the County to request they use those funds to help maintain the City ballfields and recreation areas. Councilman Collins asked if there was a timeline for the new SDS agreement. Mayor Lariscy stated he believed October to be the deadline. Councilman Collins asked what voice Guyton would have. A discussion then took place discussing the law in regards to the SDS.

Mayor Lariscy reminded those in attendance of the 7 PM meeting to be held this same day.
